This sculpture proposal extends my current body of work regarding unknown mechanisms that seem to be part mechanical and part animal. I have frequently used references to farm or earth moving equipment in this body of work. This site seems a perfect fit with this theme.

Like many people who spend their life building things, the time spent working with my hands has developed into a past time of investigating tools and machinery. Trying to deduce what something was used for and how it works is a natural tendency for many. Understanding an object's purpose can alter the way it is viewed. Things that work similarly, or even the same object can be viewed very differently, based on its surmised purpose and our own history.
